was all silence and oldness, all serene and lifeless. The old building stood strong for years and became the witness of different generations passing by. It imprinted within its history, different names having their own unique stories, different lies and truths that were being shared and kept; and all these were engraved to the depth of its soul forever. Some will be remembered and some will be forgotten. Sadness crept unto me and I realized I already miss the place... a lot.

On my way home, after I appointed my enrollment, water started to pour down from the sky. It rained. I tried to recall and I remembered that it was quite a while since it last rained. Then like the thirsty land bequenched by the fresh rain, my sadness altered after I realized one thing - summer was ending. And unlike any other people who love the freedom on summer and hate the wetness of the rain, I continued walking under the cold rain - soaked and excited - knowing that summer is closing and another formation year is opening soon.

June 7. Summer has officially ended and another formation year has formally begun. It was just like yesterday since our last formation year ended; and now another formation year has just begun. But I could never deny the sad reality that all of us were not meant to stay here forever. No one

was an exception. No one could prevent it. Many had left already. Some will leave soon; and some, later. Sad it may seem, still we had to accept it. And though we had a slight increase of population in the community, unfortunately there was a decrease of number of enrollees this year. We only had 15 for the grade 7 and 11 for the pre-college. The sudden decrease may perhaps be a frightening trend happening for the previous years already; nonetheless, alarming it may seem, we could do nothing but to "... pray for the Lord of harvest to send more laborers to His vineyard," and to never give up on promoting the priestly and religious vocation. We should face these unexpected realities and never lose hope. Let us continue living by accepting and learning from the days gone by, looking forward and hoping for the days, yet to come and treasuring the present-day to the fullest. And speaking of the present day, it was June 7, and all of us were called to return to the seminary. Since it was the first day of another formation year, everybody was busy. All were working on their individual responsibilities: cleaning every corner, arranging things accordingly - all in preparation for the upcoming activities and events. I could hear all the noise from the working community and I could truly feel that summer was no longer in the air.

June 9. That day was just an ordinary day for all of



us. But for the chosen incoming grade 7 and pre-college students who decided to be formed as future priests, it had become the mark of a new beginning. A fresh beginning that would change their lives forever. It was an afternoon and everyone was there: families, friends, relatives and new faces were everywhere, new cars, new bags; a lot to memorize, to remember and to be familiar with. Different expressions and emotions were everywhere as well. Nothing could be hidden and denied. One moment there were smiles and laughter. Another moment, silence and tears. Soon warm embraces and meaningful kisses flooded the room as a symbol of love, friendship, and goodbye. But despite the guise of sadness in every eye of the newcomers, there rested an unexplainable indication of excitement and adventure, so strong and obvious no one can doubt. And the long afternoon came to an end as a new life begun.

June 15. After six days, we celebrated our annual acquaintance party where talents, uniqueness, and personalities in some place primarily unveiled and revealed. Newcomers were one by one formally introduced to the community and in return, we gave them our warmest welcome. This year's theme was "Juan De la Cruz," an adaptation to an inspiring teleserye of ABS-CBN about the power, boundaries, and meaning of love and freedom; and the

struggle in making choices. It simply shows us the three natures of man: the good, the evil, and the man struggling in between; and by that we got a wonderful lesson - "... evil is beyond the reach of no man. But man can never step beyond evil's reach. Not in this lifetime. But that does not mean that we are doomed to have a life of evil rather a lifetime struggle with evil..." That is why all of us should be a tagabantay first of ourselves and second of one another. And we should also always bear in mind that we are nothing without the grace from Boss. So by thanking him for the wonderful presence of each one and by asking His grace, we ended the meaningful party with a prayer.

I was awakened by the loud yet comforting sound of the rain one early morning. But as I opened my eyes, it soon stopped and I found the earth united with the sky. It was disturbing yet amazing to know that darkness somehow made everything one. However, sooner than I expected, while everybody was still in bed sleeping, my window slowly emerged from the shadows as the dawning light of the sun gradually consumed and mantled the dark sky. And I thought... soon, everything will reveal its beauty. Soon, silence will come to life.

society (specifically during elections), not only on their duties as citizens but, above all, as Christians. In the PPCRV, we were involved in giving talks and seminars on the sanctity of the vote, poll-watching, putting up voters' assistance desks, and many more. Our aim in the PPCRV is "CHAMP" – to work for Clean, Honest, Accountable, Meaningful and Peaceful Elections.

The seminarians were grouped in three's or four's and were assigned to different clusters of parishes called vicariates. For the first timers, this year's summer pastoral exposure was really exciting although accompanied with doubts, questions and curiosity. Even if filled with challenging tasks, as a whole it was enjoyable.

One reason is that PPCRV pastoral exposure is a very unique experience we undergo once or twice in our seminary years. Besides, it is undeniably a challenging and work-filled compared to the usual summer pastoral program. Some had to go to far flung places they have never been before - and alone at that! Some of us also said they were very nervous in giving lectures and talks to people who were older than them. Some worked straight from eight in the morning to seven in the evening just to go to barangays to conduct the voters' education. Others stayed up late in the evening and even until the wee hours of

morning to get things done.

A lot of us had to do things we have never done before: processing application forms, conducting lectures and training, gathering Election Returns, making negotiations and dealing with professionals, specifically the Board of Election Inspectors, and a lot more.

Some had to invite people they have never met before and asked them to volunteer for PPCRV. There was some hesitancy for many of us asking people to volunteer. We thought then that, like us, they would rather relax in the convenience of their homes and become uninvolved in the election process. But then, we were amazed at how people just kept on coming to volunteer themselves even without incentives. This was also, for many of us, a source of strength when we were working with people who would equal (if not surpass) our sacrifices and doing so joyfully at that.

On the other hand, our summer pastoral exposure was not only about elections. We also enjoyed staying in the parish and seeing its real situation: the different kinds of people we have to deal with, the schedules, the tasks at hand, the situation of the parish and the communities around, and a lot more – a real first-hand experience of what we have to deal with when we become priests.

Serving in the mass is something that we shouldn't



forget! Majority of us were serving in the daily masses, some even served all masses – an opportunity we all grabbed because basically it is one of the most concrete things that we could do in order to help the priest and the parish. We also enjoyed talking to other people especially those in the convent and the church. Some of them would ask about our seminary life and our vocation stories. Others would ask us questions related to serving the mass, about the parts of the mass, and many other questions, not to forget, "Te Bro, ma-pari ka gid man?"

Moreover we also enjoyed staying with the priests - some of them would go out with us and treat us to dinner. Some would share their experiences to us when they were seminarians, and some even asked us to stay even after the summer immersion was over, and yes, some of them asked us to come back whenever we have time or whenever we want to!

Other than these experiences, realizations and happenings, we were also blessed with new acquaintances in the parishes, the convents, and the communities – friends who are there not only to bond and enjoy with us but also to help us in our vocation. For instance, some of us were given tasks by the priests then suddenly we would be surprised that others would ask – "Bro, din ta maubra? Ano dala-on ta? Te ubrahon ta adto

subong?" without us asking for their help or even without the priest's request! We were just surprised with their initiative and were wondering what motivates or pushes them to do this. We were really blessed with people like them. All of us really gained a lot of new friends, friends who would help us and hang out with us even though we have just met them. And we have also learned a lot from their lives and experiences.

We also realized that a lot of people really expect great things from us. A lot of them would ask questions from us and the funny thing was, sometimes we ourselves didn't even know the answer! We also realized that a lot of people have little idea about seminary life and would curiously ask, "Naga-ano kamo didto man, ano gina-ubra ninyo? Puro lang na didto pangadi? Ano man? Explain bi?" These kind of questions really make us smile and these are the types of questions that we would eagerly and gladly answer – somehow, a kind of vocation campaign.

Summer pastoral exposure are indeed great and unforgettable experiences for us seminarians: the lessons learned, the inspirations, the friends, the priests, the people, the happenings, the realizations, the moments, and the memories. These are things that we could really bring with us as we go on with the formation. 🕯
